

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"A dreamer is one who can find his way only by moonlight and his punishment is that he sees the dawn before the rest of the world." -Oscar Wilde

Nearly three years ago to the day (April 7, 2018), I sat inside of the Broadhurst Theatre in New York City waiting for the Broadway production of Anastasia to begin. Prior to seeing the Broadway production, I read about the various changes they'd made from the animated film to not only fit the stage but to honor the historical accuracy of the story. Keeping an open mind, not only did I willingly accept the changes, but I loved this whole new take on a familiar story.

This is not the movie. This is a musical which honors its historical roots while playing with the magical realism of the famous legend and paying homage the critically acclaimed movie. This is a story of a young woman who is a fighter. A young woman who fought her way across Russia in search of "home, love, family." A young woman who forges a new identity for herself while searching to uncover her past.

While we may not have forgotten our origins and background like Anya, at one point or another we have all grappled with the question "Who am I?" And, like Anya, we can pave our own way rather than becoming a victim to circumstance. Our journeys may be a lot less physical and literal than that of Anya, but in this journey of life we make choices that define who we are and create our own identities.
